Skewers – choose from prawn, lamb, beef, chicken or tofu – are char-grilled in the open kitchen and served with steamed rice. Choose between the traditional peanut sauce or a marinade based on the secret recipe of the owner's Indonesian grandmother. A few extra dollars will pad it out with diced carrots, red onion, radish and cucumber and krupuk (crunchy vegetable crackers). There's also Bintang beer for anyone wishing to revisit memories of their Bali holiday.
